Admission Requirements

Applicants:

1. should hold a bachelor's degree from a recognised university or equivalent; AND
2. should have a degree from a university in Hong Kong or an English speaking country/region; or submit one of the following original score reports/certificates for assessment (within the past 2 years):
 - TOEFL (minimum score: 79 internet-based);
 - IELTS (Academic) (Band 6.0 or above)*;
 - College English Test (CET 6) of the PRC (450 or above)
3. with a background in social sciences or humanities will be preferred.
